It's hard to believe it's the same city we left. In fact most of our friends and contacts have had a good time joking with us at how we "ran away" and now we're back. Most have assured us that Guinea will never go to war...we'll try and remember that next time! Thanks so much for all your prayers during this time. It's good to be home!!
